## Stuart Hakes FSGT

Stuart is well known to many Council and industrial members. He is CEO of FIC (UK) and has been a stalwart supporter of the Society for many years particularly in relation to Furnace Solutions. He currently serves on the Melting Technology Committee and the Board of Fellows. He is a New Zealander and Glassmaker who has worked all around the world principally in the container industry. He has lived in the UK for many years and his developmental work with FIC in the field of electric melting and boosting is recognised throughout the glass container industry.

## Marc Brew FSGT

Marc Brew gained an Honours Degree in Applied Chemistry from Trent Polytechnic in 1974 and joined the United Glass Research and Development Centre at St. Albans in the same year. Initially his work was essentially a laboratory-based Glass Technical function but later included management of the Central Quality Assurance Laboratory before leaving in 1995. In 1996 he gained a PGCE (F E) from Greenwich University. After teaching Chemistry and Materials Science at Further Education Colleges in Hertfordshire he then moved in 1998 to Sheffield and managed the Product Performance Laboratory at Glass Technology Services. He left GTS in 2005 and since then has worked independently as Brew Glass Technology and Training Ltd concentrating on the investigation of glass breakage of all types including working as an expert witness in both Civil and Criminal Cases.

Marc joined the Society in 1984 and was elected a Fellow in 1991. He has served on various Committees including Secretary of the London Section and Chairman of the Yorkshire Section gaining both the Redston Award and the Keeton Award respectively for his services. He has served several terms on both Council and the Board of Fellows.
